## Director's Report: September, 2018.

We have had a very busy and fulfilling term. Since our last newsletter all groups had the opportunity to participate in a Book Week experience with our local librarians from Albany Creek Library. The children were able to find out about book week, look at some of the nominated and award-winning books and listen to some of the stories (Bw Exploring and EYLF Learning outcome 5). During book week, we also participated in the "Premier's reading challenge". Throughout the week each group of children were involved in 20-60 shared literacy experiences at Kindergarten and at home.

Individual classes continue to extend on the children's interests to create positive learning outcomes. Mrs Wilson's class developed a strong interest in dinosaurs and explored this in great detail. The group used books, craft, music, construction play and much more to express both new and prior learning. It was a great opportunity to build mathematical skills as we used non-fiction books to measure and compare the sizes of dinosaurs- Did you know the Brontosaurus would have to wrap its body around our entire classroom to fit in? More recently the group have been looking at Emergency services and other occupations. This interest evolved from a friend telling us about visiting the local Fire station and a Police station being built in the block area.

Both of Mrs Bull's groups have continued to explore different ways of telling stories by making their own puppets and using story blocks to build a story. They have added words to paintings and also used magnets to make up stories. With the Premier's Reading challenge, it opened discussions about our favourite stories. Outside, both groups have been keen to "go camping". They have done nature hunts and dinosaur fossil expeditions as well. The Yellow group have also discussed recipes and their favourite foods. As a result, they cooked vegetable soup and are looking forward to making sushi.

The Young Kindergarten children have been experiencing different textures such as clay, mercury dough and slime. They have been enjoying watching the silkworms grow, which are now big enough to handle. The group continue to enjoy sharing stories on outdoor experiences. It was lots of fun showing the Dads the Kindergarten and dancing the Hokey Pokey with them.

Miss Russell's class have been involved in many science investigations. Each week they have had a new concept to explore in the experiments. The children have been doing very well at hypothesising the outcomes. They have also been involved in different cooking experiences while working on their basic numeracy, pre-literacy and reading foundation skills and understanding time. The class are looking forward to their upcoming excursions to further extend the learning that is occurring within the program. The highlight of the term so far has been the Father's mini Olympics, in which they competed for their teams with their Dads in a variety of relay races.

Thank you does not seem to cover the amount of time and effort that was put into organising our Trivia

Night. From all accounts the evening was full of fun, entertainment, strategy and hard work. We are currently going through some quotes to make major renovations to our playground over the next few years and our aim is to use most of the funds raised from the trivia night to achieve one stage in the near future.

Our Father's and special guests got to spend time within the classroom as each group celebrated Father's Day/ Open nights. There was a morning mini Olympics and many evenings at Kindergarten.

We continue to be grateful for the great support we have had from families at the recent working bee. The results of this community effort were fantastic and we eagerly await the judging of the Albany Creek Garden Clubs' Biannual Garden Competition at the end of the term.

Thank you to all families who completed the Family Survey and this will soon be analysed and used for future planning.

During August and September all groups have participated in Fire Evacuation Drills. On Tuesday 4th September we ran our Open Morning in conjunction with "C and K open week". We had a small number of families come and have a look, but all seemed to enjoy their experience.

Educators have continued with professional development and the sharing of ideas with each other. All staff have now updated their CPR, Asthma and Anaphylaxis training for the year and three staff competed their full first aid training this month (which is completed every three years).

During the pupil free days for the Green, Blue and Yellow Group educators went through some of the latest information around assessment and rating for the updated National Quality Standards. Educators looked at ways to continue to meet an Exceeding rating and adapted new templates and reflected on current practices to ensure continuous improvement.

We wish everyone a safe and relaxing school holiday break and look forward to the excitement of term 4.
