## **Our Children**

The four Kindergarten groups had the opportunity to explore the rainforest with the Evergreen Theatre Group last week. The children have developed concepts of the importance of maintaining the trees of the rainforest as they give the animals a place to live and help give us air (oxygen). They also discussed the importance of taking our rubbish with us if we enter the rainforest. This experience links to the Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF) Learning Outcome 2 (Children are connected with and contribute to their world).



Mrs Taylor's Young Kindergarten has been making connections with Australia as some of the class members have done extensive travel in Australia. They have utilised stories and discussions about many parts of Australia and what can be seen. The children have also enjoyed hunting for various objects in the garden, role playing in their restaurant and observing some interesting science experiments.

## **Our Children**



Mrs Wilson's class began the term with the continuation of their interest of animals that hatch from eggs and then moved into dinosaurs (who also hatched from eggs). The children combined prior knowledge with discussions to extend this interest. They became creative with art mediums, explored literacy to build knowledge and utilised song and music to make better connections.



Miss Russell's class have been involved in a wide variety of experiences including extending their knowledge of Aboriginal culture, exploration of the park and upper creek area beyond our Kindy, completing different forms of artwork for the QIEU art competition, exploring more about dinosaurs as well as participating in Ninja Warrior courses that are challenging their gross motor skills, perseverance and ability to work as a team.



Mrs Bull's classes have been extending interests in Space following discussions and connections to a recent eclipse. They have used a variety of resources and discussions to build and extend their knowledge. They have also been involved in science experiments to hypotheses, research, investigate and inquire.

We were overwhelmed by the amount of Woolworths Earn and Learn stickers we were able to collect this year. We gained over 21,000 stickers which as allowed us to order over \$2200 resources. In term 4 we will be receiving a range of STEM resources to promote early coding skills, building and constructions sets to promote creativity and fine motor strength, Aboriginal games and puzzles to link to the development of our RAP and immerse our children in cultural connections and other resources to enhance our play environment.
