

OUR EDUCATORS/STAFF

Staff began the year completing self-assessments and setting goals for the year with their team and Directors. These goals will be worked on and evaluated throughout the year.

During the pupil free week in January all educators were involved in reflecting on information gathered in 2018 from families and children to create new QIP (quality improvement plan) goals. These can be seen in displays outside each unit, with the full document in the foyer. Our new goals focus on strategies to enhance critical reflection throughout the service, assisting in the promotion of healthy eating and varied dietary needs of groups, developing an appreciation of the natural environment, extending professional development opportunities, building children's emotional development, strengthening networking with local school and creating further opportunities for smooth transitions and developing systems for the Educational leader to be effective and supportive.

Staff have already begun to participate in professional development such as researching the new Queensland Kindergarten Learning Guidelines and C and K curriculum approach due out in June. They have also participated in information sessions around the new C and K Affiliate model and inclusive funding.




How can I find out what is happening at Kindergarten and what my child is experiencing?

Here at Albany Creek Kindergarten our number 1 priority is to spend time with your child throughout the whole day. We aim to engage them in a variety of child-initiated, child-directed, intentional teaching or teacher-lead experiences. At Albany Creek Kindergarten we highly value sharing these experiences with families and carers.

Some ways we can collaborate together:

- Parent Roster (a bird's eye view of the day to day experiences at Kindergarten)
- Informal conversations with educators at drop off and pick-up.
- The Day Book/ Collaborative Journal with a summary of the day/weeks activities (Young Kindy receive a newsletter after the day is complete)
- Photo displays
- Class and Centre newsletters
- Children's individual portfolios
- Displays and daily notices
- Email (please be aware that educators do not regularly check their email while teaching, if you have urgent communication please phone the Kindergarten)
- Formal meetings (this can be requested at any time and a mutually convenient time can be arranged)"
- Scheduled informal chats
