The Young Kindergarten children have been very interested in how things grow particularly silkworms and plants. They have been watching silkworms grow and have planted seeds which will grow. During book week they talked about each other's favourite books and enjoyed a visit from the librarian. They have had fun role playing in a vet surgery and welcomed a new friend Josie and her family to the group.

Mrs Wilson's class have enjoyed exploring the outdoor space looking for nature and using their acquired science knowledge. In particular, some children went on a magnet hunt both inside and outside to find things made of metal. They then created their own signs "metal" and "not metal" to display. During the outdoor exploration the wilting sunflower was reborn as the children planted their own seeds; they continue to enjoy



Miss Russell's class have recently been involved in many science investigations. The children have enjoyed participating in varied experiments, including cause and effect, motion and magnetism. We have also further extended our knowledge about dinosaurs. The groups' excursion to Coles was a great opportunity to further extend their learning outside of the classroom and give them a true hands-on experience. The highlight of the term so far has been the Father's mini Olympics, in which they competed in teams with their Dads in a variety of relay races



Both of Mrs Bull's groups have been developing an understanding of science concepts. They have explored physical objects, observed effects and represented and communicated their interpretations. They have also discussed being an author and illustrator as we read/ told different styles of stories during Book Week. The yellow group are looking forward to toasting marshmallows on their campfire this week.

National Child Protection Week (1st-7th September)

During August and September all groups have participated in Fire and Lockdown Evacuation Drills. Our aim is to instil a concept of personal safety for children and can cover sun safety, road safety, personal space, body awareness and building positive relationships. This is always a timely reminder to ask families and carers to:

- Continue to provide appropriate sun safe hats (6cm full brim hats), clothing (shirts covering shoulders at a minimum) and applying sunscreen upon arrival at Kindergarten.
- Ensure your child holds the hand of an adult in and around the Kindergarten carpark and discuss road and car safety.
- For the safety of all please avoid leaving children alone in cars.
- Talk to your children about supportive adults in their own network e.g. Mum, Dad, Grandparents, Family friends, teachers, police etc

Our Educators

Educators have continued with professional development and the sharing of ideas with each other. We hosted a Professional Network Meeting (PNM) with other C&K educators on the 22nd August and worked together to unpack the new Curriculum Approach.

On Wednesday 14th August Mrs Bull and Mrs Wilson met with Albany Creek State School Prep teachers, Deputies and other Early Years providers around the area. We looked at ACSS's AEDC data and brainstormed the impact of this for children within our community. We also shared thoughts on the skills/disposition's children require as they enter school. These were broken up into the AEDC domains- Emotional Maturity, Social Competence, Communication skills and General Knowledge, Language and Cognitive skills and Physical Health and Wellbeing. Some of the qualities included: resilience, self-regulation, kindness, empathy, turn taking, independence, looking after belongings, seeking help, asking questions, clear articulation, eye contact, interest in numbers and letters, recognition of written name and writing name, concentration and imagination.
