
Our 4 year old Kindergarten classes have all been keenly preparing for their next phase in life. We have had many discussions about life in Prep and they have begun to share their orientation experiences. We have also been having some festive season fun and revisiting some of our favourite things to help celebrate the end of the year.

Even though the year bought many challenges we have been able to all overcome them, create new 'normals' and move forward in positive steps. A big thank you to everyone who has been able to volunteer throughout the year. No matter how big or how small your contribution was, we would not be able to provide such a high-quality educational facility without you.

Both the Blue and Yellow groups have been "Going on a bush walk" where they created the bush with trees, vines, a river and animals. They discussed what animals they might see and how to look after the animals and the bush. As some children also attended Bushcare, they discussed how some animals were nocturnal like the Tawny Frogmouth we have been watching in the tree in the cul-desac. To further develop their knowledge, they read lots of stories about Australian animals and the First Nations People. This sociodramatic play also coincided with Outdoor Classroom day and NAIDOC week. The children were excited to spend the whole day outside especially having a rest outside too.



This term the Red group have further explored the members in our community who help us, beginning with doctors, nurses and pharmacists. They welcomed a number of parents who shared their occupations with us. We especially enjoyed learning about how pharmacists help us (they now know they don't work on a farm!), extending our knowledge about bones and they experienced getting a plaster cast on their arm. This term they have also participated in visits to the park, creek area, enjoyed mud and wet days and continue to prepare for Prep.



The Green Group have been extending their Numeracy and Literacy skills following interests in number games and creating their own storybooks. The class wrote letters to their Grandparents and then enjoyed reading some reply mail. They have been creating lists with initial sounds and other concepts. The class also enjoyed Outdoor Classroom Day as they went for a bush walk and did everything outside.



The Young Kindergarten children have continued to watch things grow including silkworms, tadpoles and seeds. They celebrated Book Week with a visit from the Librarian and sharing favourite books. Writing to the Grandparents inspired the setting up of a post office providing wonderful role play. They have become very independent and ready to be 'big' Kindergarten children.
