# August 2023 Newsletter

**Director's Report** Committee Meeting 8 August

Since our last meeting, our major stakeholders have been involved in the following activities:

### **Families**

The children and staff continue to enjoy having families on roster to be able to participate in the program and have a

first-hand view of what their child likes about Kindergarten. Over the past month or so some families have also taken up the opportunity to either use roster or a separate time to speak to their child's teacher about their child. This opportunity is always available to families so please contact your teacher if you have anything you wish to discuss.

In June, 33 families took up the opportunity to have their child's hearing screened with Hear and Say. This again proved to be highly beneficial with 58% recording hearing within normal limits, 24% with hearing outside the normal limits and recommendation to seek further advice and testing, 12% recording middle ear tube disfunction and 6% with other middle ear issues.

Our Term 3 Bush Care event with Moreton Bay Council was well attended with 5 Educators, 2 Community Members, 6 parents and 10 children. We enjoyed a morning of weeding, exploring and using cameras to view the nesting boxes. We ended the morning with a lovely morning tea provided by Deb from the council.

## **Educators**

Educators have been busy completing their annual compliance training involving child protection, workplace health and safety (including fire training), workplace bullying and sexual harassment and Privacy. The team also continue to attend various professional development opportunities such as Auslan signing, supporting children with additional needs and music workshops. They have also been involved in team reflections and readings lead by myself as Educational Leader.

Our enrolments for our kindergarten classes in 2024 are in full swing and we are confident we will fill all four of our Kindergarten classes. We continue to await advice on how "Free Kindy" will work next year (especially for children doing a second year), but are grateful to have Early Childhood Education at the forefront of State Government funding as we believe such opportunities set children up for a positive future learning journey. We will continue to build on our marketing efforts to ensure the future viability of our Community Kindergarten, with waiting list numbers for future years continuing to grow steadily.

#### Children

We were pleased to welcome back our children and families to Term 3. We are very thankful to those families who have helped keep our Educators, Children and Families safe and healthy by keeping children home when they are unwell. We wish them all a speedy recovery and remind families to notify your teacher of all absences, including any relating to COVID, Influenza and RSV.

Our 4 year old Kindergarten classes were able to enjoy an incursion with the Evergreen Theatre company. We engaged in the Rainforest show and discovered new knowledge about the environment, sustainability and the characteristics of the rainforest through puppets, story and songs. This linked well to all sections of the curriculum related to communication, connectedness and learning.

Our Kindergarten philosophy states "We empower children to become powerful learners and active citizens. We value their input and respect their individuality". Here is how each class has embodied

this statement:

Mrs Carli Wilson's RED GROUP reflected on their holidays, which led to a camping game, where they had tents set up in the classroom, in the playground and at bush kindy. Lots of imaginary play was involved by building fires to cook 'soup, fish and fox.' This also inspired games such as the 'survival game' at bush kindy. Bush kindy days have been full of adventure, and they have been enjoying having their morning tea in the bush and returning to kindy in the afternoon. One of the highlights was 'Going on a Bear hunt' ... crossing the creek, walking through a 'bubble' snowstorm, and finding a bear in a cave. They have also been learning to sew and are making nature prints by hammering flowers and leaves onto fabric. The current interest involves experimenting with making individual paint palettes by mixing primary and secondary colours, creating a pizza shop and a princess game with its very own castle.






Mrs Tracey Wilson's **GREEN GROUP** have continued to enjoy their Bush Kindy experiences and are becoming more engaged and confident within the environment. Some favourite activities have included jumping from the big log, knot tying, searching for and trying to catch bugs, making a slide down an embankment, making stick kebabs and rope courses with carabiners. The group has continued an interest in a planet song to extend it to lots of discoveries about planets, space travel and the solar system. The group enjoyed lots of painting and craft activities, links to Indigenous star mapping, stories, rocket experiments, songs and music and puzzles to build this interest. The group enhanced their knowledge through great questioning and investigating the answers.

Mrs Janelle Bull's **BLUE** and **YELLOW** groups have been following their interests from Bush Kindy. They have been using torches, magnifying glasses and binoculars on their visits to the bush. In the classroom they had been pretending to be nature detectives. This also gave the children an opportunity to think about those animals they might see at night in their backyard.

Our visitor, Kevin from Evergreen Theatre Company in his show "The Rainforest" also talked about 'Stop, Look and Listen' when in the rainforest. The groups also practised this on their last Bush Kindy day still hoping to see the platypus. In the show the talking tree intrigued the children. Following the show the children also made their own puppets.

The other interests the classes have been following is with colours. They have tried marble painting, dropper painting and even tested out making mini volcanoes when they used coloured vinegar in a tray of bi carb.

The yellow group were particularly interested in the obstacle course. They have helped plan the actions (eg up a ladder) in their daily course.

## Fun ways to encourage your child to brush their teeth


- Build good oral hygiene habits early
